

Do you know about Independent Advocacy

Information for parents

Independent advocates do not give advice; they are there to help you to gather information, think about choices and to have your say.

The independent advocate is not a legal representative. Independent advocates help a person or group to get information they need to make real choices about their circumstances and supports those people to have their views and wishes heard. Independent advocacy organisations do not provide any other services.

Independent advocacy is a way to help people have a stronger voice and have as much control as possible over their own lives.

How could it help me?

- Supporting you to attend meetings.
- Getting your rights upheld.
- Writing up your own reports towards a meeting, they will not write it themselves but will support you to write your own views.
