

# A map of advocacy across Scotland 2007-2008 edition

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#### INTRODUCTION

The Scottish Independent Advocacy Alliance (SIAA) is a membership organisation responsible for promoting, supporting and defending independent advocacy in Scotland. It has the overall aim of ensuring that independent advocacy is available to any person in Scotland.

The SIAA was asked by the Scottish Government to produce this updated map of Scottish advocacy. The purpose of this report is to map advocacy around Scotland between April 2007 and March 2008. A previous report was produced by the Advocacy Safeguards Agency in January 2004. The data reported in 'A Map of Independent Advocacy Across Scotland 2003-2004' has not previously been updated. This updated report shows the amount spent on advocacy in the year 2007 to 2008 and gives a picture of the numbers of people using advocacy. This will help in measuring the impact of advocacy across Scotland.

To gather the information advocacy organisations were sent a copy of a questionnaire. This was followed up with a telephone interview during which the questionnaire was completed. Information was available from most advocacy organisations. Unfortunately, we were unable to gather information from all organisations. Staff from the SIAA gave organisations additional opportunities for submitting information however there are some gaps in the data. This is, therefore, not a complete picture.

The map also does not include information from commissioners, in part because, currently, not all NHS Boards or Local Authorities have a named person responsible for commissioning advocacy.

The criterion for inclusion in this document is that the organisations deliver advocacy. All the organisations included in the map have told us that they do provide advocacy although not all organisations are independent. The SIAA recognises that there are a number of organisations that provide advocacy as well as providing other services and that this is a pragmatic way of increasing the advocacy available to the people who need it most. However the SIAA encourages Health Boards and local authorities to support organisations to move towards independence. Data from non-independent and independent organisations is included in this report and the independent/not independent status is included for all organisations' entries.

The report has been divided into NHS Board areas and includes a description of individual advocacy organisations, their level, source and security of funding. Some organisations have more than one entry as they work in more than one health board area. An analysis of the funding data is shown at the end of the document.

This report is published only in electronic format. It is aimed to update the information on a regular basis and to continue to develop the report in response to further information needs identified. Any ideas for future inclusion in the next update should be sent to

#### Gaps in advocacy provision

Advocacy organisations were asked for comments on or about any gaps identified in advocacy provision in Ayrshire and Arran.

#### Comments

- Statutory funders only look at learning disabilities and mental health in terms of funding. Wider needs for advocacy are not being met - for specific groups e.g. for people with physical disabilities and/or for specific issues e.g. child protection issues.
- Concern over the implementation of the Adult Support and Protection Act and the likely resource implications.
- Need to promote advocacy for young people in order to ensure universal access.
- There are gaps in provision of advocacy in Child & Adolescent Mental Health.

- Forth Valley Mental Health Steering group funds a 14 hour post to provide advocacy for people with a dual diagnosis of learning disability and mental health who are detained in Loch View Hospital under the Mental Health (Care & Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003. There are a number of people who live in Loch View but are not detained and have no access to advocacy.

#### Comments

- It can be too narrow criteria to access advocacy. This can leave vulnerable people without anywhere to go.
- There are differences between local authorities. For example, for children and young people, provision is ok in Glasgow but less so in other local authority areas. In Glasgow there is a lack of advocacy for carers.
- There is a lack of advocacy provision for people who are homeless, people with physical disabilities, people with Aspergers' syndrome and young people in transition.
- Having to prioritise advocacy for people at Mental Health tribunals has resulted in people with mental health problems having less opportunity to access advocacy for other issues.



#### Gaps in advocacy provision


There is no carers' advocacy for families of patients detained in the State Hospital.





The total advocacy spend, as reported by advocacy organisations, by NHS Boards, local authorities and the Scottish Government from 2007-2008 is £7,771,526

That figure equates to a total statutory spend, per head, per annum, of £1.54.

The total spend, from all sources, statutory and non statutory, on advocacy from April 2007 to March 2008 was £8,726,869. This equates to a total per person per annum spend of £1.72.

#### CONCLUSION

As can be seen there are differences in availability of and spend on advocacy around the country. It is not possible to make direct comparisons between organisations or between different health board areas as this is not comparing like with like. Different population sizes, advocacy approaches, client groups and differences between rural and urban areas will have an impact on organisations.

Most organisations commented on gaps in advocacy provision in their areas, some of the comments are included in the relevant health board area section.

There were themes identified in these discussions around gaps in provision nationally.

#### • Need for development and funding of advocacy in prisons.

Many organisations reported a lack of advocacy in prisons. The recent study into mental health problems in Scottish prisons, 'Out of Sight – Severe and Enduring Mental Health Problems in Scottish Prisons' found that over four in every hundred prisoners has a severe and enduring mental health problem and that, in addition, a very large proportion of prisoners have some form of mental health problem. As the right of access to independent advocacy for anyone with a mental disorder is included in the Mental Health (Care & Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003 advocacy should be available to prisoners. Some advocacy organisations reported that they had been approached regarding the provision of advocacy in prisons however no additional funding was available for this.

#### • Need for development of advocacy and equality of access

Other groups for whom there is limited or no advocacy provision include:-

Asylum seekers and refugees

Black and minority ethnic communities

Physical disabilities

The LGBT community

Deaf people

Children and young people – particularly in relation to the Mental Health (Care & Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003

Homeless people

People with drug and/or alcohol problems

For some of these groups advocacy may be available depending on where they live, for others there is no specialist advocacy support and, in some instances, no access to independent advocacy. For example, provision of advocacy for carers and for older people is patchy, available in some health board areas and not in others. Access to collective advocacy is also patchy.

#### Need to ensure independence for advocacy organisations

The Mental Health (Care & Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003 places a duty on Health Boards and local authorities to secure the availability, for people with a mental disorder, of independent advocacy. Not all organisations currently

providing advocacy for those with mental health problems are independent organisations. Advocacy planning partners and commissioners should consider the independence of organisations; ensure that organisations work within the Principles and Standards for Independent Advocacy and support organisations to work towards independence where necessary.

#### • Prioritisation and available resources

Since the implementation of the Mental Health (Care and Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003 many mental health advocacy organisations have reported that they are required to prioritise work with people in tribunals. Due to limited resources they have therefore been unable to meet all of the demand for advocacy unrelated to mental health tribunals. We plan to gather additional information directly relating to the impact of the Act for the next edition of this document.

#### New developments

The SIAA is aware of some new advocacy developments currently underway. Saheliya, an Edinburgh based Black and Minority Ethnic Women's Mental Health organisation, is developing a peer advocacy project. AMINA – Muslim Women's Resource Centre in Glasgow is developing a volunteer advocacy project. The Stroke Association Scotland is working with the SIAA to develop advocacy for survivors of stroke, their families and carers.

These developments are welcomed and help in the move towards ensuring that advocacy is available to all who need it. There is still some way to go in achieving this aim.



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
